

## **GENERAL NOTICE NO. 4** Recyclability<sup>1</sup> of paraffin-coated paper/cardboard

## SUMMARY

- The purpose of this general notice is to assess the issue of paper/cardboard packaging with paraffin. It solely concerns paper/cardboard which is used for household packaging and contains some paraffin. This packaging can be any of the following: Flexible paraffin-coated packaging paper, Flat cardboard packaging impregnated with paraffin by dipping, Corrugated cardboard packaging covered with paraffin using different techniques. It can be used for specific purposes. - This notice was issued because the presence of paraffin related to the receipt of uniform batches of paraffin-coated packaging in the paper recycling process is generally liable to give rise to visual defects (translucent marks) or paraffin deposits on paper machine parts would impact operation. However, on an industrial scale the small quantity of household packaging containing paraffin entering the recycling process does not affect the process; no negative impact is observed, and this packaging is allowed in the stream of household packaging to be recycled and the paper/cardboard based packaging conventional. Moreover, a complete line including lightweight particle filters and cleaners the state od the art eliminates the paraffin and produces paper of satisfactory visual quality without the cleaner parts getting clogged.

This notice considers these conditions.

## IN CONCLUSION

**Household packaging containing paraffin** is considered **recyclable** in the paper/cardboard packaging recycling stream, provided it meets the stream's recyclability prerequisites<sup>2</sup>.
